### **Back to School Forms and Communication**

It would be greatly appreciated if all back to school forms that were distributed to families on Monday could be completed and returned **by this Friday 10<sup>th</sup> February.** This will assist our admin staff and our teachers in communicating effectively with you throughout the year.

We are aiming to streamline our communication in 2017 so that you are not inundated with multiple forms of the same message. The **Lyrebird Word** will continue to be published every second Wednesday and sent to families via Tiqbiz. (It is also uploaded to our website)

**We ask that you upload and use the Tiqbiz app as the main form of communication between home and school.** (See Janette or Clare if you need assistance.)

In the past communication between teachers and parents was mostly via email. This year all class teachers will be contacting you with information about how to download **Class DOJO**. This worked really well in some of the junior grades last year so all classes are going to use this app in 2017. Year 5-6 teachers will also continue to use EDMODO. Fortnightly class newsletters will not be distributed to families but regular updates will be forwarded home via DOJO. **Please look out for the hard copy message about DOJO from your class teacher(s).**

## **Parent Helpers in the Classroom**

We value the wonderful support that we receive from our parents and other volunteers. You are most welcome to assist in your child's class and information will be forwarded to you by your child's teacher. We will be holding two sessions for parents that focus on assisting in the classroom learning program. (**Wed 15<sup>th</sup> Feb and Wed the 22<sup>nd</sup> Feb from 2:30-3:30 in the LLLC.**) The second session follows on from the first and we encourage interested parents who have not completed these sessions in past years to come along and join in. They will be facilitated by Leahanne Griffiths. Please note that all volunteers in our school must hold a current Working With Children Check and must carry this on them at all times. (WWCC) All visitors, parent helpers and volunteers ***must*** sign in at the office.

## **Student Attendance and Safety Before and After School**

It is imperative that your child is at school every day and on time to line up with their classmates on the first bell at **8:55am**. Children who arrive after 9:00 must be signed in at the office. Please ensure that your child knows who is picking them up each day. Chat to them about what they would do in the event that you (or the designated adult) are held up. A staff member is on yard duty until 3:45 and students are asked to go directly to the office if they haven't been collected by then. If your child walks home they should start walking home straight after school while our crossings are being supervised. Younger students can play on the senior playground and the oval before or after school but they must be closely supervised by their parents or carers at all times.

Please take care when driving on the roads and streets around our school and other schools. VICROADS and DET send the following reminder to all families.

*"Motorists should be aware that children in traffic are not like adults. They can be unpredictable and because they are small, they can be hard to see. So take extra care and slow down when you drive past any school. Research shows that slowing down helps to both avoid crashes and reduce their severity. According to the Monash University Accident Research Centre, an 11 per cent reduction in speed reduces road deaths by 40 per cent. Even a small reduction in travelling speed dramatically increases the chance of a child surviving a collision."* Thank you for your support and your patience in following the designated speed limits around our school.

**A reminder that the Forest Park car park is only to be used by staff members and parents who are dropping off or picking up children from OSHC.** Please be vigilant in following all traffic signs in our local streets and remember not to block any driveways. The focus will be on how your child has settled into their new class and the sharing of relevant information that will assist the class teacher in catering for your child's learning needs.

## **DET Insurance**

Please read the below details to ensure you are fully aware of the department's policy on student insurance:

*Parents/guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance/transport and any other transport costs.*

*Parents/guardians can purchase insurance policies from commercial insurers The Department does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools and it has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property.*

## **Upwey South Primary School Council 2017**

School councils comprise of parents, the principal, staff and community members. School council elections are held in February or March each year. All parents or guardians of students enrolled at the school are eligible to nominate as parent members and staff as DET members. The school community will be informed if an election is required. A community member can be co-opted by the school council and does not have to be a parent at the school.

The process for our 2017 School Council Election process begins today with the “**Notice of Election and Call for Nominations**” from interested parents and staff members. The date for the close of nominations is **Friday 17<sup>th</sup> February**. Parents and staff can self-nominate and SC members whose 2 years is up can renominate. The following table indicates the number of positions sought during the 2017 nomination and election process.

School Council meets approximately 8 times per year – usually twice per term. Members are also asked to be on one of the Sub-Committees of School Council and this is determined at the first meeting of the new council. Office bearers for 2017 are also nominated and elected at the first meeting. Currently our Sub-Committees are **Finance, Education, Marketing and Communications and Facilities**. The first School Council Meeting for 2017 will be held on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> February. Our current president Adam Laurie will preside over the first part of this meeting which is the final meeting of the 2016 School Council. We extend our appreciation to Adam for his tireless work for our school and wish the Laurie family all the very best for the future.

**Please contact the school office if you would like a nomination form. They can be collected in person, emailed or posted to you. Contact me if you require further information about the role of a school councillor. The following general information from the Department may be helpful.**

### **General Information for Parents (From DET Guidelines)**

#### **What is a school council and what does it do?**

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within statewide guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

#### **Who is on the school council?**

For most school councils, there are three possible categories of membership:

**A mandated elected Parent category** – more than one-third of the total members must be from this category. Department of Education and Training (DET) employees can be Parent members at their child’s school as long as they are not engaged in work at the school.

**A mandated elected DET employee category** – members of this category may make up no more than one-third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.

**An optional Community member category** – members are coopted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. DET employees are not eligible to be Community members.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

#### **Why is Parent membership so important?**

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school. Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying in itself and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

#### **How can you become involved?**

The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, which are held in Term 1 each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant.

In view of this, you might seriously consider standing for election as a member of the school council or encouraging another person to stand for election.

#### **Do I need special experience to be on school council?**

No. What you do need is an interest in your child’s school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school’s future.


## Holiday Thanks

## CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE – IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS/CARERS

Dear parents and [carers](#),

From 2017, families from our school may be eligible for financial assistance to help them meet the cost of transporting children to and from school.

The financial assistance – known as a conveyance allowance – is designed for students who can't access free school buses, and helps cover the cost of public transport, private car and private bus.

To be eligible for a conveyance allowance, students must be of school age and:

- attend their nearest government or non-government school appropriate to their year level at which admission is permissible;
- reside 4.8km or more by the shortest practicable route from the school;

The conveyance allowance is paid by the Department of Education and Training to families via the school.

If you think your child may qualify for a conveyance allowance, please contact the school to discuss eligibility, and for further information on the application process and payment amounts.

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students.




