

School Timetable Structure for 2018

This year, we have altered our learning timetable to maximize opportunities for students to focus upon their learning. Each morning the bell rings at 8:50am, at which time students are expected to enter the classroom and prepare for their learning day. As a whole school, we then begin our morning with handwriting, before moving onto explicit spelling lessons across the school.

We begin with handwriting, as it is a lower cognitive load task, allowing our learners time to code-break and prepare for the increased learning rigor of the next session.

ART EXTENSION UPDATE

THE MURAL IS NOW FINISHED

We are pleased to announce that our new school mural is now completed and up on the outside wall of the library.

Myself and a team of hardworking and reliable Grade 5 and 6 students have spent many lunchtimes creating this amazing piece of Art. From start to finish it has taken around one and half terms to complete. Over this time the students have dedicated at least one of their lunchtimes each week to paint the mural.

The concept was created by the students. They knew that they wanted to incorporate an Aboriginal flag into the mural. When brainstorming ideas, we discussed the meaning of each part of the Aboriginal flag- the black representing the night sky, the yellow circle representing the sun and the red representing the earth. We then decided that instead of including a single flag in the mural, we would make the flag the central focus of the mural. The handprints at the bottom of the mural are the hand prints of many of the students who created the mural.
