- ⇒ relocation and upgrading of First Aid facilities

What facilities upgrades have been achieved in Term Three cont'd:

- ⇒ relocation of the Literacy Support Program in the Junior Building
- ⇒ purchasing of new seating for the Junior Learning area
- ⇒ upgrading of planter boxes in the community vegetable garden

What facilities upgrades are planned to occur over the holiday break:

School holiday periods are one of the busiest times for schools, as it is during this break that we have multiple contractors on-site undertaking works which cannot be completed during normal school hours. For this holiday break, the following works are planned:

- ⇒ relocation of the Out of School Hours Care Service (Extend) from the old house to the Lifelong Learning Centre
- ⇒ servicing and installation of new roller shutters on the gymnasium in preparation for bushfire season
- ⇒ new carpet to be laid in the main corridor outside of the administration and specialist classes
- ⇒ painting of external seating for students
- ⇒ installation of the Advanced Art Club mural at the front entrance of the school
- ⇒ installation of the Outdoor Chalkboard for the junior playground
- ⇒ line marking for disabled parking at the Morris Road carpark
- ⇒ additional planting of trees to support "National Tree Planting Day" on Monday 18th September.

As you can see from the above upgrades, School Council are committed to providing our students with an improved physical learning environment.

Thank you for a wonderful term and please enjoy the term break with family and friends. I look forward to learning alongside you in Term Four and beyond.



Dear Families,

As Upwey South Primary School Council President, I am pleased to announce that Damien Kitch has accepted the position of Principal at our school starting in Term Four of this year.

All government school principals are employed directly by the Department of Education (DET), and as with all DET positions there is one more step in the official process, a review period for fourteen days starting today. The position is confirmed when the Merit Protection Board advises either that no review has been lodged or that any review has been resolved, so until that time, the appointment is considered provisional.

After the appeal period closes, confirmation of the substantive Principal will be sent to the school. So in the first week back of Term Four an official welcome to the new Principal will be made.

I would like to thank the other members of school council for the assistance in this process, and in particular Rhonda Burge as parent representative on the panel, Gary Monopoli as the staff rep, and Clare Butterworth for admin assistance. Thanks also to all the staff for their input as well.

I would also like to thank Damien for applying for the position. With our review period for the school's Strategic Plan about to start, it is a very exciting time for our school, and we have a lot to look forward to.

I think all parents and staff would agree that Damien has brought a fresh approach to Upwey South Primary School and has achieved some fantastic positive results in just the term so far.

Performing in front of up to 10,000 people would be daunting for even the most seasoned professional.

But for students Charlie Mustoe (The Patch Primary) and Olivia Hibbins (Upwey South Primary) it represents an exciting opportunity, as the talented duo prepare to showcase their skills at the Victorian State School Spectacular on Saturday 16 September.

In a fun-filled family event, students from over 200 schools will be participating in dance, music, song and more as part of the huge annual event.

Gaining the chance to hit the stage is no easy task, though, with Charlie and Olivia both needing to audition and beat hundreds of fellow students for the opportunity.

For Charlie, 12, who will fill a role as ensemble vocalist, this will be his first spectacular.

"Me and my friend were kind of wanting to do something, so we decided to audition and I just happened to get in," Charlie said.

"I often perform with my sister on stage, playing drums, but I also play trombone and sing."

Meanwhile, for Olivia, 11, this will be her fourth appearance and said the thought of performing in front of a large audience didn't faze her.

Olivia will be part of a choir.

"I do get a bit nervous, but very excited, too," she said.

"I recently played the lead role of Prince Marvellous in a school pantomime. I enjoy singing and dancing."

Their appearance at the spectacular is no accident, though, with both students practicing hard during out-of-school hours, including on weekends.

To be a part of the Victorian State Schools Spectacular requires a huge commitment on the students' part, as well as the schools involved.

Depending upon their role, they commence rehearsals from six months out from the event and those in the Mass Dance and Mass Choir make weekly rehearsal commitments for about five months before the event.

The Victorian State School Spectacular will run over two shows on Saturday 16 September at Hisense Arena in Melbourne.




