A Message from the Principal

Welcome back for Term Four at Upwey South Primary School.

This term promises to be another fabulous term for our school community. As a teaching staff, we have been very fortunate to share with our students the wonderful and varied experiences of travel, learning, and family time which were shared over the holiday break.

The holiday break is an extremely busy time for schools, and for our school we achieved a number of significant facilities projects, with significant improvement being made to the physical layout of the administration area. This is the first step as we will continue to work over the coming 18 months to improve learning facilities across the school.

Throughout Term Four, our shared Inquiry area of study is based upon the Science of Learning, with students exploring The Physical World, through investigating the overarching question “How does the world around me work and how does science help me learn more about my world?”

This overarching line of questioning is taught through a number of focus units throughout Term Four, with the following units being the focus for the beginning of Term Four:

Foundation: The Science of Animals and their Habitats
Year One/ Two: The Science of Mini-Beasts and their Habitats
Year Three/ Four: How and why do natural disasters occur?
Year Five/Six: The Science of the body and Biology



In exploring the above concept, Adam approached his teachers and the Principal to express his wishes to achieve two things through his Service Learning Initiative, which are:

- 1– Raise awareness and support for families across our community, who may be experiencing hardship due to a family illness.
- 2– Provide students with an opportunity to work on their drawing skills, complementing our Term Four school theme of creative thinking.

Adam has chosen to achieve the above by providing students with the opportunity to purchase portraits, which he has drawn of popular and historically well-known characters. Spotlight on Foundation

Literacy

This week the Foundation students have been exploring the rime 'in'. They have been blending sounds whilst reading and writing and using basic punctuation in their written pieces of work. During their reading groups, the students have been searching for interesting words, building on their reading ability through Reading Eggs, telling a connected story using pictures and reading books together.



Our writing sessions have consisted of writing a re-count about our holidays and focused handwriting sessions. The students are learning to plan their writing, write their re-count and then edit their work. The students use onset and rime to sound out words. They also have been focusing on their handwriting. Starting at the correct point, using the correct pencil grip and having good body posture are very important.



Spotlight on Foundation

Numeracy

In numeracy this week we have been looking at the order of numbers and counting forwards and backwards. The children have been skip counting as well. Some numeracy groups have been matching the numerals to their word names whilst others have played some games to enhance their counting ability. Computer programs such as Galaxy Kids Maths and Targeting Maths are a fun way to practice our numeracy skills using the computers.



Why do tigers have stripes?

Inquiry

This term our students are learning about the animal world. They will be comparing characteristics of animals, learning about habitats, looking at how animals move, how we care for pets and create a diorama showcasing an animal, its habitat and survival requirements. Our excursion to Myuna Farm will be a great immersion into the topic.



Marvellous Movers with Lego


Making a smoothie, mixing a cake, riding a bike, fidgeting with a spinner, plus all kinds of manufacturing involve machines which move.

Mentoring Gifted Kids is an extra-curricula program designed to meet some of the special needs of children who are **advanced thinkers and fast learners, with high potential for learning****.

The program is conducted in school and in school time, 1 hour a week, 8 weeks per term, with small groups of children from Grades 1 to 6, and is parent-funded. Children can become eligible for the program through various tests.

** Children with high potential for learning may show some of these characteristics:

- Requires less sleep than other children
- Has high energy levels
- Quirky sense of humour
- Has advanced ethical and moral concerns
- Able to achieve at a high level, may not always do so.
- Flexible, creative thinker
- Understands abstract concepts well ahead of others the same age
- Highly perceptive of own and others feelings, needs.
- Perseveres for long periods of time in special interest areas
- Gets on better with older children and adults
- Has an inquiring mind, highly curious
- Sets high standards for self, perfectionist tendencies
- Excellent vocabulary for age
- Able to solve problems quickly and often creatively
- Believes that school is for learning
