From the Principal



Term 3 Acting Principal News

It is with great pleasure that I inform the school community that Mr Damian Kitch has been appointed as the Acting Principal of Upwey South Primary School for Term 3. On behalf of everyone at Upwey South, I warmly welcome Damian to our school. Damian has been the Assistant Principal of Glen Waverley Primary School for the past 5 years. Since the start of 2017, Damian has been the Acting Principal at Knox Central Primary School in Boronia. Damian will be visiting our school on Friday and I will take him around to every class and introduce him to staff and students. Parents will have the opportunity to meet Damian in the early weeks of Term 3 when he takes over my yard duty both before and after school. Please look out for Damian's introduction to the school community via the Lyrebird Word in the first week of next term. You are also most welcome to attend any of the assemblies in Term 3 and introduce yourself to Damian. I wish Damian all the very best as he takes on the leadership of our school next term.



Semester 1 Reports

Next Thursday, 29th June, your child will bring home their mid-year report together with their Learning Portfolio. A letter of explanation will be included with your child's report. Their report will summarise their achievement so far this year and their portfolio will contain an ongoing record of progress throughout Term 1 and Term 2. I know that you will discuss your child's progress and their achievements in a most positive and supportive manner. There are always areas of learning that need improvement or developing. Please support your child over the holidays and into next term in order to boost their confidence and their skills in the nominated improvement areas. Literacy and Maths will continue to be our core learning areas. Three hours per day is focussed on reading, writing, speaking and listening and maths in every classroom across the school.

I'm sure that all parents can remember their favourite curriculum areas from when they were at school? Did you ever have a time where you struggled to keep up? Did you ever want to 'give up' because other students found the work easy and you found it challenging? Mathematics was an area that I used to find personally challenging as a primary and secondary student. I always managed to 'pass' but it was only when I had to teach this important curriculum area that many of the core understandings actually 'fell into place'. I had been trying to solve complex problems as a student without the necessary understandings and skills and most of my early learning was rote learning. At Upwey South we aim to provide our students with a skill set of understanding and knowledge that they can apply to new problem-solving in maths. We want our students to be able to explain how they arrived at an answer rather than by just applying a rote formula.



The new Victorian Curriculum contains four additional Curriculum areas called Capabilities. The skills and values taught and promoted aim to develop positive, insightful, engaged, reflective and socially responsible citizens of the future.

The Victorian Curriculum Capabilities are:

1. The Personal and Social Capability
2. The Creative and Critical Thinking Capability
3. The Intercultural Capability, and
4. The Ethical Capability.

The Personal and Social Capability is explicitly taught from Foundation through to Year 10. It is an area that we assess in on-going ways, and you will find within the end of Semester 1 report an indication of where your child is placed against the standards that we expect to see in students of the same age.

The **Personal and Social Capability** is essential as it enables students to understand themselves and others, while learning to manage their relationships, lives, work and learning more effectively. It involves students learning to:

- recognise and regulate emotions
- develop empathy for others
- understand relationships
- establish and build a framework for positive relationships
- work effectively in teams
- develop leadership skills
- handle challenging situations constructively.

The Personal and Social Capability supports students in becoming creative and confident individuals with a strong sense of self-worth, self-awareness and personal identity. Being 'capable' in this area of learning enables them to better manage their emotional, mental, spiritual and physical wellbeing, with a sense of hope and optimism about their lives and the future. On a social level, it helps students to form and maintain healthy relationships which can be very challenging for some students. The learning doesn't just happen within the classroom. So much is learnt during recess and lunch play. While teachers are on Yard Duty they support all students to stay safe, behave responsibly and engage positively with other students.



Parent-Teacher-Student Conferences

Please note that the mid-year Conferences will be held in the first week of next term from Monday 17th July until Thursday 20th July. We encourage you to bring your child along to the conferences together with their portfolio. Future learning goals and priorities can be set at the conference. If you would like to speak with your child's teacher for longer than the 10 minutes allocated, it is advised that you make a further appointment at a mutually convenient time. Each class teacher has nominated their availability and there is information in today's newsletter about how to make a booking with your child's teacher. If you would like to speak to one of the specialist teachers about

your child's progress, please contact them via a note or a call to the school office.

Bookings open tonight at 4:00pm and close next Wednesday at 4:00pm.


