Year Three - Year Six Student Agency Electives

Dear Year Three - Year Six families,

A focus of our new School Strategic Plan (SSP 2022- 2026) is providing opportunities for increased student voice, agency, and engagement.

As such, we are launching Year Three - Year Six Student Agency Electives.

ACTIONS REQUIRED BY YOU:

- 1. Commit time to read the information below as a family.
- 2. Respond with your elective preferences by Tuesday 21st March 2023.

In order to make this information easier to understand and access, it is presented in a Q&A format.

What are Student Agency Electives?

Student Agency Electives (or electives as they are referred to in this letter) are an opportunity for all students in Year Three - Year Six to engage with electives from a variety of subject areas which may not appear within the traditional primary school curriculum.

Who can take part, and when will electives occur?

All students in Year Three - Year Six will be taking part.

Elective subjects will be conducted each Friday during Session 6, with some electives also involving the third recess on a Friday afternoon for setup.

The program will commence in Week 9, Term One - Friday 31st March 2023.

Electives cycles will run for the duration of one term, with new elective and subject choices being made for the following term.

Electives will not be held during the first and last week of each term.

What if elective timetabling clashes with an extra-curricular out-of-school event?

Due to the busy nature of school calendars, and the wide variety of community groups which we partner with, this may happen on the odd occasion.

If this occurs, students will be encouraged to attend the out-of-school event as a priority.

Who will lead the elective subjects, and how were they chosen to be offered?

Electives are being facilitated through a combination of school staff and community partners.

The current electives have been offered to provide 'something for everyone' based upon what we know about our students.

If a supervising staff member is unavailable to facilitate an elective session (eg: an absence with no replacement available) students from this elective will be allocated to another elective for that session only.

During the first session of each elective cycle, students will be provided with the opportunity to voice what they would like to learn within the subject area.

Moving forward, we intend to provide students with increased opportunities to have voice when formulating future elective offerings.

When are student elective preferences due back to school?

Being provided with elective choices is a great opportunity, but it also requires great responsibility from students.

Student elective preferences must be returned to classroom teachers <u>no later than Tuesday 21st</u> <u>March 2023.</u>

Students who do not return preferences by this date will be placed into an elective subject with remaining vacancies.

How will the school allocate elective preferences?

This is a challenging task for the school. The nature of elective programming is that students may not always get their top choices.

All students must be resilient and thoughtful when selecting electives.

The school will endeavour to provide students with their highest possible elective preference, based upon the following criteria:

- Any prerequisite requirements for the elective
- Group dynamics and sizing
- What staff know about student learning.

Remember, electives are an exciting learning initiative which will continue to be offered, with each term presenting a new opportunity for students to list new elective preferences.

What are the electives on offer, and how do students choose?

This information is over the page.

Read the elective descriptors over page, and return your preference form to your classroom teacher <u>no later than Tuesday 21st March 2023.</u> All electives detailed below will be held during Term Two, 2023. Should an elective preference include localised excursions, permission will be required via Compass as per normal school protocols.

Some electives may be in high-demand, and therefore may be offered in repeated terms. Some electives may also change dependent upon demand. At this point in time, students cannot partake in the same elective for two terms within the one year.

Kids in the Kinder

Group sizing limit:

- Maximum of 10 students

Elective Summary:

This elective is targeted at students who enjoy helping younger peers, and may even be considering being a teacher in the future. You may even just be someone who loves helping out as a bigger buddy for younger children!

We will visit the Dandenong Ranges Childcare Centre each Friday and assist with teaching younger students, from toddlers to four-year olds. Sometimes we might also attend localised excursions with supervising staff.

Getting down with a deck

Prerequisites:

Group sizing limit:

Elective Summary:

In this class you will be learning everything about skateboarding! We will run through how to maintain your skateboard and what all the parts of the skateboard are. When we have learnt all about skateboard maintenance, we will start getting comfortable on the skateboard and we will learn how to control it. Once we understand this, we will begin to practise some basic tricks and then we will get to have a look at and pick our own tricks.

During wet weather, we will undertake group projects such as 'deck art'.

DJ-ing, Sound Engineering and Radio Production

Elective Summary:

Have you ever dreamed of being on the radio? Do you want to learn how to produce music, sound engineer and learn about what all of the cool buttons on a mixing-deck do? Maybe you just want to hear your own voice on the radio and produce your own content - interviews, radio, talk shows. We can teach you how to do all of this and more!

In this class we will learn how to write radio programming, collect and edit sound-bytes, stings and music. Working as a team we will produce at least one radio show which will go to air over the school's speaker system and be played during a Wednesday afternoon timeslot on 3MDR 97.1FM. Audiences will even be able to download your show as a podcast...so cool!

Digging up the past - Palaeontology

We will take part in localised digs both at school and off-site, and learn from guest speakers who actually work in the field!

Elective Summary:

No-cooking cooking class...what even does that mean???

In this class you will learn how to safely cook food without the use of an oven (yes that's right you can cook and feed yourself yummy and healthy food when there are no adults around to help you...BONUS!)

Do you want to learn more about cooking and food preparation? Do you want the chance to make and eat yummy food at school? Learn how cook for yourself when nobody else at home will do it for you! Come along and learn how to make yummy, delicious and nutritious snacks without the use of an oven.

Elective Summary:

Auslan is an expressive visual language that Deaf and hard of hearing people use to communicate in addition to their family and community members. It involves hand shapes, movement, body position and facial expressions.

In this class, we'll explore simple phrases, lots of useful signs, learn the Auslan alphabet and play fun communication games whilst gaining an understanding of Deaf culture.

We will also learn how to mentor and teach others students at our school, and work up our confidence to hold Auslan conversations.

Aerobics - the sport of fitness

As a qualified language teacher in Korean, Mandarin, Cantonese, and Japanese, Michelle Lee can teach you common words, phrases and cultural aspects of these amazingly rich cultures.

This unit will start with learning all about Japanese Manga culture. Manga is the Japanese version of comic books, and you will even get the chance to create your own comic with the correct use of manga techniques.

Elective Summary:

We are looking for 10 rockstars to form our first ever USPS Rock Band!!!

Our school Rock Band will be made up of students who can play the drums, guitar, keyboard, etc as well as some confident vocalists. The ideal 'rockstar' will currently be enrolled in instrumental lessons at school, including glee and vocal lessons (as this will enable extra focussed rehearsals).

Ms Lang is currently so excited, she is even organising a live tour schedule for later in the year!!!

Knitting Kids

Group sizing limit:

- Maximum of 15 students

Elective Summary:

Knitting Kids is targeted at students who are interested in learning a variety of knitting techniques, and working with textiles and patterns to make interesting projects.

This class provides lots of opportunity for students to learn how to make and create clothing items, decorations, bag tags, etc. You name it... we can teach you to make it!

Everyone is welcome, and no experience is required. Let's get creative!!

Masters of Mountain Bikes

Prerequisites:

- Students must have their own approved bike helmet (AS/NZS 2063:2008); helmets will be checked by staff prior to taking part in practical lessons
- Students must have their own correctly fitting bike (can be a mountain bike or BMX) which is appropriate for both road and trail riding; *bikes will be checked by staff prior to taking part in practical lessons*
- Riding gloves are highly recommended
- A willingness to take part in group rides within and beyond the school boundary

Group sizing limit:

- Maximum of 12 students

Elective Summary:

Do you want to learn how to manage and maintain your bike - such as how to fix brakes, wheel punctures, re-chain, fix gearing, adjust handlebars, seats, and everything else that moves!

Once you are confident with the above, then your bike can take you anywhere from the open road to single downhill mountain trails!

In this elective you will gain knowledge and understanding of the road traffic environment, road laws, and bike safety. You will develop the physical and cognitive skills to manage your bike and be a safe cyclist; both on your own and as part of a riding group.

Dependent upon your demonstrated skill-level, we will work with jigsaw-jumps, flat surfaces, obstacles, and rough-terrain riding.
