## Year Three- Year Six Student Agency Electives

Dear Year Three- Year Six families,
Following discussions with students in Year 3-6, we will be offering student electives again in Term Four 2023, with the bonus that students may select an elective that they have already taken part in.

Elective subjects will be allocated based upon student preferences. If a subject has remaining vacancies following 1-4 preferences, then students who have already undertaken this elective may be allocated, with preference being given to Year Six students.

Please be aware that students in our school band, and those students who have qualified for the aerobics team will not take part in allocating a Term Four preference.

2. Respond with your elective preferences by Tuesday $10^{\text {th }}$ October 2023.

## What are Student Agency Electives?

Student Agency Electives (or electives as they are referred to in this letter) are an opportunity for all students in Year Three- Year Six to engage with electives from a variety of subject areas which may not appear within the traditional primary school curriculum.

There are multiple new electives on offer for Term Four, therefore please read through all options available.

Is there updated information I should be aware of?
Yes. There are three updates for you to be aware of:

1. Students may select an elective which they have already undertaken. If a subject has remaining vacancies following 1-4 preferences, then students who have already undertaken this elective may be allocated, with preference being given to Year Six students.
2. Students who are in the following electives will remain in their allocated elective for the duration of the year, and do not need to list electives:

- School of Rock- USPS Rock Band!
- Aerobics- the sport of fitness

3. The above electives are not available for other students to select, therefore they have been removed from the Term Four listing.

## Who can take part, and when will electives occur?

All students in Year Three - Year Six will be taking part.
Elective subjects will be conducted each Friday during Session 6, with some electives also involving the third recess on a Friday afternoon for setup.

The Term Four program will commence with an orientation session in Week Two, Term Four - Friday $13^{\text {th }}$ October 2023.

Please note that the electives program be held on the following dates:

- Friday 13th October 2023
- Friday 20th October 2023
- Friday 27th October 2023
- Friday 10th November 2023
- Friday 17th November 2023
- Friday 1st December 2023


## Who will lead the elective subjects, and how were they chosen to be offered?

Electives are being facilitated through a combination of school staff and community partners.
The current electives have been offered to provide 'something for everyone' based upon what we know about our students.

If a supervising staff member is unavailable to facilitate an elective session (eg: an absence with no replacement available) students from this elective will be allocated to another elective for that session only.

During the first session of each elective cycle, students will be provided with the opportunity to voice what they would like to learn within the subject area.

When are student elective preferences due back to school?
Being provided with elective choices is a great opportunity, but it also requires great responsibility from students.

Student elective preferences must be returned to classroom teachers no later than Tuesday $10^{\text {th }}$ October 2023.

Students who do not return preferences by this date will be placed into an elective subject with remaining vacancies.

How will the school allocate elective preferences?
This is a challenging task for the school. The nature of elective programming is that students may not always get their top choices.

All students must be resilient and thoughtful when selecting electives.
The school will endeavour to provide students with their highest possible elective preference, based upon the following criteria:

- Any prerequisite requirements for the elective
- Group dynamics and sizing
- What staff know about student learning.

Remember, electives are an exciting learning initiative which will continue to be offered, with each term presenting a new opportunity for students to list new elective preferences.

## Prerequisites:

- Students must have their own approved bike helmet (AS/NZS 2063:2008); helmets will be checked by staff prior to taking part in practical lessons
- Students must have their own correctly fitting bike (can be a mountain bike or BMX) which is appropriate for both road and trail riding; bikes will be checked by staff prior to taking part in practical lessons
- Riding gloves are highly recommended
- A willingness to take part in group rides within and beyond the school boundary. We continue to ride in the rain and mud!

## Elective Summary:

Do you want to learn how to manage and maintain your bike- such as how to fix brakes, wheel punctures, re-chain, fix gearing, adjust handlebars, seats, and everything else that moves!

Once you are confident with the above, then your bike can take you anywhere from the open road to single downhill mountain trails!

In this elective you will gain knowledge and understanding of the road traffic environment, road laws, and bike safety. You will develop the physical and cognitive skills to manage your bike and be a safe cyclist; both on your own and as part of a riding group.

Dependent upon your demonstrated skill-level, we will work with jigsaw-jumps, flat surfaces, obstacles, and rough-terrain riding.
